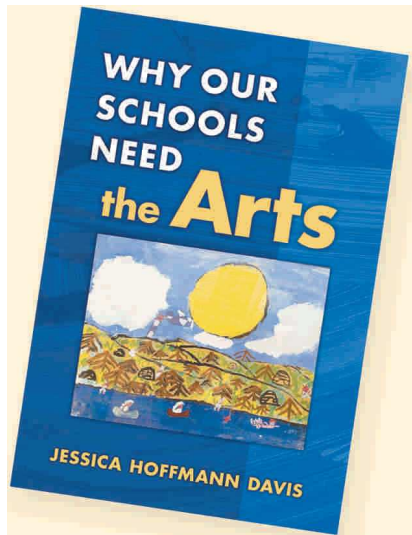




ORDER FORM: *Why Our Schools Need the Arts* by Jessica Hoffmann Davis
